




These **Probians** stay on track

All are welcome to join us next week and become regular walkers at the track.




Meet your Management Committee


JOANNE SUTMAN TREASURER


Jim likes to read and walk and, of course, sample a nice glass of Red. He looks forward to serving as your Membership Chair of our new Escarpment Probus Club.


The Bridge Club had its first game Tuesday, November 5th at the home of Jeanne and Don Reid. We had 10 players.
