

Canadian flyer gets personal

'ajor Colin Coakwell, our speaker for the January Probus meeting captivated our audience with his personal experiences; first flying fixed-wing aircraft and then on to a career flying helicopters.

His world-wide experience of drug interdiction with the RCMP, G-8 protection and service in Bosnia in 2003 and Afghanistan in 2011.

Major Coakwell joined the Canadian Forces in 1994. For the last two years, Major Coakwell has served as Operations Officer, where he was responsible for day-to-day flying operations and the development of the unit training program in preparation for High Readiness status.

He is now stationed at the Canadian Forces College in Toronto where he is currently attending the year-long Joint Command and Staff Program and is pursuing a Masters Degree in Defence Study.

Many questions on the staff, equipment and politics of his job were then asked from the floor. This was a very enlightening and informative presentation.


February: Drury Lane Theatre - Music Hall Presentation, 20 tickets have been distributed.

The book that we reviewed was called *The Guernsey Literary Potato Peel Pie Society* by Mary Ann Shaffer and Annie Barrows. The book recalls the German occupation and life immediately following WWII in the Channel Islands. *The Potato Peel Society* came into


being quite by accident as a group of individuals were on their way home following a secret meal of roast pig and were questioned by the Germans. To

cover their tracks the *Potato Peel Society Book Club* was born. A young writer was sent a letter from Guernsey asking for information on a specific author. Thus began the story composed of letters of the residence of Guernsey and the young writer from England.

As we went around the group introducing ourselves I was intrigued by how much the book touched each of us, whether due to our individual backgrounds, where we grew up or for knowing a family member or friend who had similar experiences. For some, this was your first time reading the book and for others your second or third time. This allowed for a lively discussion and insight on a more personal level of what it was like following the war.


Would we recommend the book? Definitely yes!


