architectural features to delight the eye. Keith presented us with five whiskies for our tasting pleasure, following are the results.



The winner of the evening was *Balvenie Doublewood 12 Yr Old Single Malt*, with a score of 86%. This whiskey was also rated number one at our Oct 2016 tasting which shows the D'Stillers have good taste. This is quite an accomplishment considering the stills they use were bought second hand from another Distillery.

Second was *Aberfeldy 12 Yr Old Single Malt* which came in with a score of 83%. This is also a whisky we rated number one in our

January 2016 tasting. Aberfeldy is the main whisky that is used/blended into Dewers White Label Whisky which is the best selling blended whisky in the USA.

Next came a tie between *Glenfiddich 15 Yr Old Single Malt* and *Glenfiddich 12Yr Old Single Malt* with a score of 78%. The Glenfiddich whiskies are famous for their green triangular bottle recognized by whisky lovers the world over. Glenfiddich Distillery produces 10 Million litres of whisky per year. The first whisky produced was on Christmas Day in 1887.

Fifth of the evening was *Glenlivet Founders Reserve Single Malt* with a score of 75%. Often described as the Distillery that started it all. Glenlivet was Scotland's first officially licensed Distillery in 1823.

All about the Birds & the Bees

n Wednesday, July 26th the Gardening Group and some other Escarpment Probus members met at the home of Len & Doreen Bennink for lunch followed by two guest speakers. The scrumptious lunch was enjoyed in their lovely garden as was the presentation by Karen, from the City of Guelph, who presented on attracting pollinators and drought resistant planting. Inside using a power point presentation Sarah, from Wild Birds Unlimited, talked about attracting backyard birds. Both guest speakers were a wealth of information and answered numerous questions. Some interesting tidbits:

· Baltimore Orioles nest it tall shade trees near water. They like to eat oranges in feeders but absolutely love grape jelly. The reason why we don't see them for awhile after numerous sightings in the spring is due to them nesting and the babies feed on insects hence the adults have less time at our feeders. Orioles are one of the few birds that eat tent caterpillars



- Goldfinches nest mid summer rather than the spring and often use dog hair or the fuzzy part of thistles to line their nests
- Grosbeaks, Cardinals, Mourning Doves and Junkos like Safflower seeds but squirrels don't; unfortunately chipmunks do
- Bees love the flower Lambs Ear and the little hairs on the leaves
- Bees have double wings whereas flies have a single wing and bigger
- To keep rabbits from eating your garden plant the perimeter with Rue an ornamental plant and herb

This was the last Escarpment Probus Zoomer Bloomer Gardening group meeting/outing. Future activities will be offered via our Activities Committee.
